The Importance Of Smoke Detectors

As many begin to decorate for the holiday, the Hagerstown Housing Authority would like to remind you of some of the rules-of-thumb for keeping your family safe:

- NEVER overload your outlets with extension cords and plugs. The electrical system, if overloaded, can be a potential for creating a fire.
- NEVER unplug or remove your smoke detectors. Not only is disabling your smoke detector a risk to your family,but it is a serious lease infraction that will result in the termination of your lease.

If you have any questions regarding your electric outlets or if you are having problems with your smoke detectors (activating for unknown reasons or beeping noises), please contact Maintenance immediately. We at The Authority want your family to have a safe and happy holiday; so please follow our lease requirements, so that we all can have a great holiday.

HEATING SEASON

Before you call Maintenance for service on your heat this season, make sure the room temperature is below 66 degrees. The room temperature must drop to 66 or below for the heat to come on. If the temperature in your unit is 66 degrees or above and you call for service, you will be charged for the call. Overtime callouts are very expensive, and you can avoid these charges (\$97.08) by checking the temperature before you call. Do not force the thermostat beyond the limit on the dial. Broken thermostats are charged to the resident. Keep your windows locked. This provides a much better seal & reduces air leakage at windows.

Remember, using your oven or stove as a heat source is dangerous and a lease violation. This not only poses a serious health risk to you but will also result in damage to your appliance (melted knobs) for which you will be charged.

SLIPPERY WHEN "COLD"

Please use caution when traveling outside of the building during the extreme cold days of winter. Periods of sun cause the snow/ice to melt and then refreeze later creating instant patches of ice. Take the extra time to avoid such areas for your safety.

BEDBUG CONCERNS

We've recently seen a rise in the number of bed bugs cases throughout our communities. During the preliminary inspection, we've found a common trend of bed bugs cases that are linked to tenants accepting used furniture and other items. This means that individuals are finding bed bugs on items, such as sofa's, chairs, etc. after it's been in their unit long enough for the bugs to spread to other places. Spending little money or no money on furniture seems like a great idea, but the reality is this will only cause a bigger burden because used furniture is commonly infested with bed bugs. Most times you can't even see where they are hiding inside the furniture until it's too late. Please be aware that any used furniture, even if it's from a second-hand store, does not always mean it is bed bug free. The best way to ensure your furniture is bed bug free is to buy new. We ask that you do not accept any old/used furniture unless you know for sure it has been inspected and cleared of bedbugs. Below are some good tips to go by.

Used furniture bed bug tips

- Don't be afraid to ask the owners of the furniture directly if they currently have or have ever had a bed bug infestation.
- Place any smaller used furniture items in a black plastic trash bag, and leave it in the sun for a few hours. The heat should kill any bed bugs.
- Do not take furniture from dumps or furniture left on the roadside. Furniture like this is generally thrown away for good reason, and bed bugs are often why.
- Avoid bringing used furniture into your home from high-risk bed bug areas or neighbors you know have had bedbugs in the past.
- Avoid used mattresses and box springs altogether. They just aren't worth the risk!
- Avoid purchasing fabric-covered or wooden furniture from yard sales, flea markets, etc., Bed bugs will hide deep inside these items and not come out until later when you are relaxing on the furniture.

And of course if at all possible just avoid used furniture altogether.

BALCONY REMINDER

Per Exhibit G, Section IC of your lease, "Nothing is to be hungover or attached to the railing, with the exception of approved satellite dishes". This includes lights, decorations, etc. We would also like to ask residents not to throw things off their balconies. Cigarette butts, bottles and bread seem to be the items most commonly found on the ground. Many people spend a great deal of time and effort making their balconies an outdoor space to enjoy; they do not appreciate having garbage thrown into their space. The Maintenance Department would also appreciate not having to pick up the garbage that accumulates on the ground.
