#### TRASH CONTAINERS

All trash cans and toters must be placed and kept in the rear of your unit. Containers must be moved after they are emptied on the day of pick up to avoid a charge. If maintenance moves your container to the rear of your unit, you will be charged a minimum of \$32.36. As always, we appreciate your help in keeping our communities beautiful.

### **MOWING SEASON**

Once again, the mowing season is upon us. Please be aware of the contractors as they mow the grass in your community. The contractor is responsible for performing his work in a safe manner. He has a difficult task to accomplish and needs your help to keep track of the small children. Please, for the safety of your children; keep them away from the workers doing the mowing.

All communities will be moved on *THURSDAY* unless it rains. *FRIDAY WILL BE THE RAIN MAKE-UP DAY*.

## **GRASS SEED**

You can pick up free grass seed at the Maintenance office to spot seed your yard. Seed and water from a watering can will improve the appearance of your lawn.

## HEAT WILL BE TURNED OFF

Maintenance will be turning off the heat in all communities on or near May 15. Maintenance will not respond to "no heat" calls after this time.

#### LOCKOUTS

Please note that there are no charges for lockouts during regular business hours, 8:00am to 4:30pm Monday through Friday. The Security Staff will handle lockouts after regular business hours at no charge only when they are available. If the Security staff is not available, it will be necessary for a Maintenance Mechanic to respond. Avoid receiving an overtime lockout charge by making sure you have your key with you before locking your door or have access to a spare key at all times. The current overtime charge is \$97.08

### **BULK TRASH PICKUP SCHEDULE**

You may have your bulk items picked up on the following days of each month:

1st Thursday: McCleary Hill

2nd Thursday: Parkside Homes and Douglas Court

3rd Thursday: Noland Village4th Thursday: Frederick Manor

Please set your items out after 8:00pm the night before your scheduled day and have them on the curb prior to 8:30am on your scheduled pickup day. This schedule will be strictly followed. Any bulk items set on the curb on days other than those listed for your community will result in a charge to the resident.

Scattered Site locations will be expected to observe the bulk pickup days published by the City of Hagerstown. Check the newspaper or call the City for dates.

## "Bed Bugs Bite, Ouch"

Yes it is true; bed bugs do bite and feed on blood. Bed bugs are a smaller insects and sometimes are considered a "lazy bug" considering their nature because they live close to their food supply and they may bite many times trying to find the easiest spot to pierce the skin to access a blood meal. Also they will hide very close to humans where people rest or sleep to have easy access to their food supply and they do not like to travel far at all. Bed bugs think of us as their refrigerator and will hang out close to the food supply Bed Bugs are found hiding in beds, blankets, couches, chairs, dressers and even clothes that are in close proximity where humans sleep.

Bed bugs will try and find a delicate area to bite on the human body and sometimes those areas end up being the face, neck, arms, ankles or easy open areas with exposed skin in an accessible spot. Most of the biting does occur at night when we are very still with no movement when the bug feels safe to come out. The areas bitten are small and sometimes you will see raised bumps on the skin. The other most common signs of bed bug bites include the redness around the very tiny puncture and some swelling associated with the affected site. Not everyone's skin will react in the same manner and many people report different allergic reactions to the bite from this insect. Bed bug bites may go unnoticed right away and or mistaken for flea or mosquito bites because the skin reactions are very similar.


Remember if you are getting bit inside your unit or you think you may have bed bugs please call the maintenance department right away. We have a full time Pest Control Coordinator that will set up a free inspection of your unit for Bed Bugs and the coordinator along with the pest control contractor will assist you with how the treatment process work and the procedures.
