You will be provided a "Coupon Book" consisting of 12 cards (one for each month). The cards will include your name, address, community, and WIPS (Walk-In Payment System) number.

REGISTERING YOUR VEHICLE

If you live in an area where there is a parking lot or parking pad behind your unit, you will need to register your vehicle with the office. Failure to do so could result in a citation or vehicle tow



USE OF MARIJUANA AND OTHER ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES

Criminal activity is cause for eviction even in the absence of conviction or arrest. Tenants have an obligation to assure that neither they nor any member of their household or guest or other person under their control will engage in prohibited drug-related or other criminal activities. Marijuana, including medical marijuana, is illegal under federal law. The use, possession or distribution of marijuana, in any amount and without regard to the use for which it is intended, is prohibited and cause for eviction

REGISTERED ANIMALS/PET SITTING

There shall be no unauthorized animal in the unit or on Gateway Crossing property, this includes pet sitting.

To register your animal, you must call the office to setup an appointment to pickup an application for approval prior to bringing animal to your home.



RENTER'S INSURANCE

It is recommended that Tenant's purchase renter's insurance to protect personal property if damaged or stolen and to insure against claims of personal injury.

Cleaning & Necluttering tips

If you're struggling and need guidance on how to declutter, here are several interesting decluttering tips to get you started on decluttering your home:

- Start with 5 minutes at a time. If you're new to decluttering, you can slowly build momentum with just five minutes a day.
- Give one item away each day. This would remove 365 items every single year from your home. If you increased this to 2 per day, you would have given away 730 items you no longer needed. Increase this number once it gets too easy.
- Fill an entire trash bag. Get a trash bag and fill it as fast as you can with things you can donate at Goodwill.
- Donate clothes you never wear.
- Create a decluttering checklist. It's a lot easier to declutter when you have a visual representation of where you need to get started.
- Take the 12-12-12 challenge. Locate 12 items to throw away, 12 to donate, and 12 to be returned to their proper home.
- View your home as a first-time visitor. It's easy to "forget" what your home looks like to a new visitor. Enter your home as if you're visiting the home of a friend. Write down your first impression on how clean and organized the home is and make changes.
- Take before and after photos of a small area. Choose one part of your home, like your kitchen counter, and take a photo of a small area. Quickly clean off the items in the photo and take an after photo. Once you see how your home could look, it becomes easier to start decluttering more of your home.
- Get help from a friend. Have a friend or family member go through your home and suggest a handful of big items to throw away or give to someone else.
- Use the Four-Box Method. Get four boxes and label them: trash, give away, keep, or re-locate. Enter any room in your home and place each item into one of the following boxes. Don't skip a single item, no matter how insignificant you may think it is. This may take days, weeks, or months, but it will help you see how many items you really own and you'll know exactly what to do with each item.
