DID YOU KNOW?

Located in Walnut Towers "A" Building Lobby and the breezeway of Walnut Towers "B" Building we now have Amazon lockers!

An Amazon locker provides you with a self-service delivery location to collect your Amazon.com packages. When your package arrives at the locker, you receive a delivery confirmation email with instructions on picking up your package. The email includes the address and opening times for the locker.

The use of these lockers requires you to have the Amazon Shopping App installed and Bluetooth on your Smartphone activated, this allows your phone to connect to the locker.



Micah's Backpack Program

A Partnership Between Washington County Public Schools, The Faith Community and Community Organizations Providing Bags With Nutritious Meals To Feed Hungry Students Over The Weekend

is a partnership between Washington County Public Schools, HARC, MD Food Bank, and more than 50 sponsoring churches and community organizations providing bags of food to feed hungry students over the weekend, the Micah's Backpack program in Washington County follows a model established in Blacksburg, VA. The program is designed to feed hungry students through a partnership between each elementary school and one or more churches/organizations in its community.

Brought to Washington County by Trinity Lutheran Church in 2010, the program now serves more than 1,150 students in 37 schools. More than 10,000 students in Washington County Public Schools are eligible for free or reduced meals and for many this lunch will be the last hot meal of the day. Children are especially hungry over the weekend when school is not in session.

How Micah's Backpack Works

Each Friday afternoon, identified elementary school children and homeless/transitional middle and high school children receive a bag of healthy meals and snacks. The filled bag may include the following individual serving-size items: cereal, oatmeal, juice, tuna, peanut butter, crackers, macaroni and cheese, soup, applesauce, fruit cups, spaghetti, ravioli, beef stew, canned vegetables, and other nutritious food.

Who Can Participate?

Eligible students are identified by the school principal and a designated school staff member such as the counselor, social worker, or community liaison. Confidentiality of program participants is maintained by the school. A permission form is provided for the parent/guardian of each eligible student by the principal or designated school staff member. The form must be signed by a parent or guardian and returned to the school before a child may participate. Middle and high schools are exempted from permission slips to add flexibility for serving homeless students.

HEATING SEASON

Heating levels that are maintained are from 66 degrees to 68 degrees. The room temperature must drop to 66 or below for the heat to come on. If the temperature in your home is 66 degrees or above and you call for service, you will be charged for the call. Overtime callouts are very expensive and you can avoid these charges (minimum of \$97.08) by checking the temperature before you call. Do not force the thermostats beyond the limit on the dial. Broken thermostats are charged to the resident. By keeping your windows locks this provides a much better seal and reduces air leakage at windows.

Remember, using your oven or stove as a heat source is dangerous and a lease violation. This not only poses a serious health risk to you but also will result in damage to your appliance (melted knobs) for which you will be charged.

REMOVAL OF WINDOW AIR CONDITIONERS

Each year the Authority requires all residents in family units to remove air conditioners from windows by October 1st. Air conditioners that have not been removed by November 1st will be removed by maintenance and the resident will be charged. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

SNOW & ICE REMOVAL

Residents of the Family Communities are responsible for removing snow and ice from walks, steps, and porches leading to their units. Residents that share a walkway shall clear their half or share the responsibility. This means any and all sidewalks to your unit with the exception of the front public sidewalk, which is the sidewalk that runs parallel to the front streets, is the responsibility of each resident. The Hagerstown Housing Authority (Gateway Crossing) does NOT remove snow and ice or treat for snow and ice on any walkways in the rear of the units and does NOT remove snow or ice or treat for snow or ice in the front of your unit except for the public sidewalk that runs parallel to the front streets. Please take caution when traveling outside during the extremely cold days of winter. Periods of the sun cause the snow/ice to melt and then refreeze later creating instant patches of ice. Take extra time to avoid such areas for your safety.

BULK TRASH PICKUP SCHEDULE

Please set your items out after 8:00 pm the night before your scheduled day and have them on the curb prior to 8:30 am on your scheduled pickup day. This schedule will be strictly followed. Any bulk items set on the curb on days other than those listed for your community will result in a charge (\$60.00) to the resident. Scattered Sites, Gateway Crossing, and Housing Choice Voucher locations will be expected to observe the bulk pickup days published by the City of Hagerstown. Check the newspaper or call the City for dates. Due to the Thanksgiving Holiday normal Thursday and Friday trash collection will be delayed one day.
