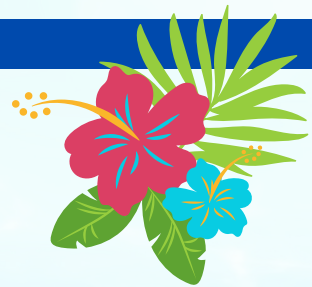

## BULK TRASH PICKUP SCHEDULE

Please set your items out **after 8:00 pm the night before** your scheduled day and have them on the curb **prior to 8:30 am on your scheduled pickup day**. This schedule will be strictly followed. Any bulk items set on the curb on days other than those listed for your community will result in a charge (\$60.00) to the resident. ***Scattered Sites, Gateway Crossing, and Housing Choice Voucher locations will be expected to observe the bulk pickup days published by the City of Hagerstown. Check the newspaper or call the City for dates.*** **Yard Waste Collection started Sunday, February 23, 2025, and will run through Friday, December 19, 2025.**

## TRASH/RECYCLE CONTAINERS

All trash cans and toters must be placed and kept in the rear of your unit. Containers must be moved after they are emptied on the day of pick-up to avoid a charge. You will be charged a minimum of \$33.48 if Maintenance has to move your container to the rear of your unit. As always, we appreciate your help in keeping our communities beautiful. ***Trash containers are not to be placed out before 4:00 pm on trash pick-up night at your community.***

## TENANT INSTALLED LOCKS ARE PROHIBITED

Tenant installed locks are not allowed and are considered a lease violation. Please see ***Section G (Tenant Obligations), Item 31*** of your lease for additional information. If tenant installed locks are found by an inspector or maintenance personnel, you will be charged to correct the lock and the door.

## WADING POOLS/SWIMMING POOLS

Residents are reminded that wading pools and swimming pools are a violation of your lease. Not only are unattended pools unsafe but they damage the lawn and impede mowing.

## INSTALLING WINDOW AIR CONDITIONERS

When installing window air conditioners, be sure to install them in a safe and secure manner. Air conditioner units should be tilted away from the unit. This allows the condensation to run away from the wall and will help to prevent mold/mildew on the walls. The window air conditioner needs to be installed properly to prevent outside air from entering the unit. If the extendable panels are missing or damaged, air coming in from the outside will cause the room temperature to rise, keeping the air conditioner running. This can cause high electric bills. It is best to seal the openings with foam panels. Cardboard, pillows, and blankets are inefficient as they can fall out leaving the window open.

***According to the Dwelling Lease Part II, under Exhibit G, Section I., F, Residents of the high-rise buildings must put a container under the air conditioner to collect any condensation and empty as needed. Do not empty containers over the balcony. Failure to empty these containers could result in a follow-up visit from the maintenance department to correct the concern of overflow. Window units are NOT permitted in Gateway Crossing.***

## NATURAL GAS NOTICE

In order to conserve, all residents must promptly report any leaks or dripping faucets, hoses, or fixtures to the Maintenance Department at 301.733.6916. Ensure that all faucets are turned completely off when you are not using. Other ways of conserving water are to:

- Avoid flushing the toilet unnecessarily
- Dispose of tissues and other such waste in the trash rather than the toilet.
- Take shorter showers
- Use the minimum amount of water needed for a bath by closing the drain first and filling the tub only 1/3 full.
- Do not let water run while shaving or washing your face. Brush your teeth first while waiting for the water to get hot, then wash your face or shave your face after filling the sink.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE: HIGH WATER BILLS

In an effort to reduce the number of high water bills, we kindly ask all residents to check their toilet(s) for any signs of running water. Please pay close attention to the water in the toilet bowl **before** you flush. If you notice the water moving or hear it running, even slightly, your toilet may have a leak. Some leaks are silent and may only be visible as a slight ripple or movement in the bowl. If you observe any signs of a leak, **you must contact Maintenance immediately**. Failure to report a toilet leak in a timely manner may result in you being held responsible for the increased water charges. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us manage water usage and avoid unnecessary costs.

## TIPS ON REMOVING MOLD & MILDEW

Mold/mildew can grow in areas that are moist such as bathrooms or at washer hookups. It is usually recognized as a dark discoloration of the surface on which it resides (i.e. dark spots on grout). There are numerous cleaning products on the market designed to kill mold. Also, a solution of 1-part bleach and 4-parts water will do the trick. Wipe down ceilings and walls with one of the disinfectants, scrub tile and caulk joints in the tub area. Always be sure to read the labels and abide by the manufacturer's recommendations. It is your responsibility to properly clean the surfaces in your unit but if you are having problems identifying or removing mold, please call Maintenance and we will have an inspector check it out at no cost to you.

## BED BUG PREVENTION TIPS

By far the most common method of developing a bed bug infestation is by bringing used furniture into your home. Bedbugs can infest many items. In order to protect yourself from infestation:

- Never take ANY furniture from a dumpster no matter how good it looks. The better it looks, the more likely it is to be infested with bedbugs.
- Do not purchase refurbished mattresses or couches.
- Do not purchase furniture at a yard sale or flea market without carefully inspecting it first.
- Never rent furniture or store anyone's furniture in your home.
- Do not purchase used books without first inspecting them carefully.
- If you are helping a friend move, or transporting other people's belongings for any reason, be sure to inspect your vehicle once the belongings have been removed.

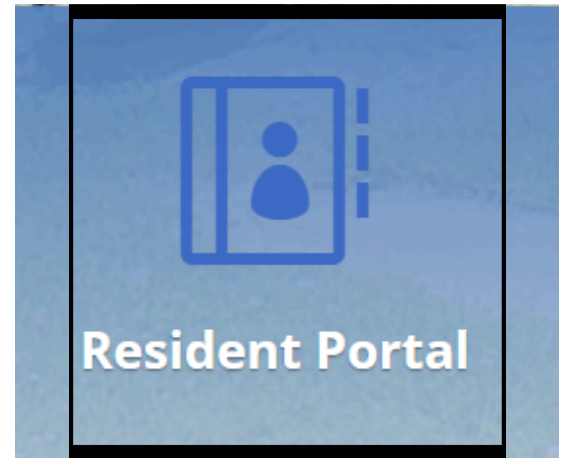

## Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP)

Eligible participants in the Senior FMNP program receive \$50 per person per year and must meet the following conditions: 1. Income is at or below 185% of the poverty level.

2. Must be 60 years or older.

3. Self-verify county residency at time of application.

Eligible participants in the WIC FMNP program receive \$30 per person per year and must meet the following conditions: 1. Income is at or below 185% of the poverty level and 2. are pregnant or have recently given birth, or 3. infants, or 4. children up to 5 years and have a nutritional need. Participants receive the benefit through their local WIC agency.



## HHA Smoking Policy Reminders



Below are a few reminders from our Smoking policy as a refresher. The complete Smoke Free Housing Lease Addendum was provided with your lease at the time of signing.

- The term “smoking” means inhaling, exhaling, burning or carrying any lighted or heated cigar, cigarette, pipe, and include the use of any other tobacco product or plant product in any manner or in any form. Smoking also includes the use of an electronic cigarette.
- Resident and members of the Resident’s household shall not smoke anywhere in the unit, including balconies, in the building where the Resident’s dwelling is located, or in any of the common areas or adjoining grounds within 25 feet of the building.
- Residents are responsible to inform their visitors and guest of the Smoking Policy.



## Recreational & Medical use of Marijuana

The Hagerstown Housing Authority wants to remind all tenants that even with Maryland legislation legalizing the recreational use of Marijuana (**July 1, 2023**), under the lease provisions, the use of Marijuana is a violation of the lease. The Housing Authority is federally subsidized and must adhere to federal law, which still classifies Marijuana as illegal (**Federal Controlled Substances Act of 1970**). If the federal law changes to support recreational use, smoking will remain prohibited in the units. This includes medical Marijuana as well as recreational use. ## Renters’ Insurance- Why It Is A Good Idea

If you rent, your personal belongings will not be protected against loss or damage unless you have a renters insurance policy. Your landlord has insurance for structural damage to the building. However, this coverage does not extend to your personal property, nor does it protect you from being liable for damage you might cause to the building inadvertently (e.g., a kitchen fire or a plumbing mishap) or to others who are injured at your property (e.g., a trip and fall over toys or furniture).

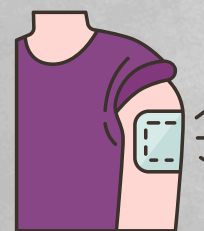
