The Housing Authority will close on the following days:

Heating levels that will be maintained in the family communities are from 66 degrees to 68 degrees. Your thermostat has a built-in thermometer that will tell you if the proper heating levels are being maintained in your home. Before you call Maintenance for service on your heating system, take a minute to look at your thermostat. The bottom portion is the thermometer. If the temperature in your home is 66 degrees or above and you call for service, you will be charged for the call. Overtime callouts are extremely expensive, and you can avoid these charges (\$103.44) by checking the temperature before you call. Do not force the thermostat beyond the limit on the dial. Broken thermostats are charged to the resident. Keep your windows locked. This provides a much better seal & reduces air leakage at windows.

Remember, using your oven or stove as a source of heat is dangerous and a lease violation. The misuse not only poses a serious health risk to you and your family but will result in damage to your appliance for which you will be charged.

### **BULK TRASH PICKUP SCHEDULE**

You may have your bulk items picked up on the following days of each month:

1st Thursday: McCleary Hill

2nd Thursday: Parkside Homes and Douglass Court

3rd Thursday: Noland Village 4th Thursday: Frederick Manor

Please set your items out after 8:00pm the night before your scheduled day and have them on the curb prior to 8:30am on your scheduled pickup day. This schedule will be strictly followed. Any bulk items set on the curb on days other than those listed for your community will result in a charge (\$60.00) to the resident.

Scattered Site locations will be expected to observe the bulk pickup days published by the City of Hagerstown. Check the newspaper or call the City for dates.

\*Due to the Thanksgiving Holiday normal Thursday and Friday trash collections will be delayed one day.

## **REMOVAL OF WINDOW AIR CONDITIONERS**

At the beginning of the heating season, all furnaces are turned on. During this change of season, the Authority requires all residents begin removing their air conditioners from the windows. Air conditioners that have not been removed by November 1st, will be removed by maintenance and the resident will be charged. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. This does not apply to the residents of Potomac Towers.

### **SNOW & ICE REMOVAL**

Residents are responsible for removing snow and ice from walks, steps and porches leading to the unit.

This means any and all sidewalks to your unit except for the front public sidewalk, which is the sidewalk that runs parallel to the front streets, is the responsibility of each resident. The Hagerstown Housing Authority does NOT remove snow and/or ice or treat for snow and/or ice on any walkways in the rear of the units and do NOT remove snow and/or ice or treat for snow and/or ice in the front of your unit except for the public sidewalk that runs parallel to the front streets.

Please take caution when traveling outside during the extreme cold days of winter. Periods of sun cause the snow/ice to melt and then refreeze later creating instant patches of ice. Take extra time to avoid such areas for your safety.

### MAINTENANCE CHARGES

Should you receive a copy of a work order in the mail for a maintenance charge and do not agree with the charge, call Maintenance at 301-733-6916. You have 10 days to request an informal grievance hearing. Do not wait until the charge appears on your rent statement to call. If the charge is on your rent statement, your 10 days are past.

# **Important Notice To All Residents**

NATURAL GAS, like all forms of energy must be used properly.

Here are some facts everyone should know about **GAS AND GAS OPERATED** equipment from a safety point of view.

GAS ACCIDENTS can be avoided ... when you follow these SAFETY RULES.

- 1. **TEACH CHILDREN** that they are not to turn on or light appliances.
- 2. **KEEP COMBUSTIBLES** (curtains, paper, fluids, etc.) away from open flame.
- 3. **IF LIGHTING IS REQUIRED** always light match first and hold it at point of lighting before you turn on the gas.
- 4. **REPAIR AND INSTALLATION** is a job for experts **NEVER** attempt to do it yourself.
- 5. **USE EQUIPMENT FOR THE JOB** it was designed to do for example an oven must not be used to heat a room.

Gas appliances, equipment and transmission lines are safe and are constantly being tested and improved. However, it is possible, to have a **GAS LEAK**. Your senses can help you discover a gas leak...

- 1. **SMELL** A distinctive odor has been added to natural gas so that less than 1% of gas in the air can be detected.
- 2. **SIGHT** In some appliances you can SEE the flame so you know it is working.
- 3. **TOUCH** With some appliances you can feel overheating or cold in the burner area which would indicate trouble.
- 4. **HEARING** If the flame sounds unusually noisy it may not be burning properly.

### IF YOU SUSPECT A GAS LEAK...

- 1. AVOID FLAME and operating of electrical equipment. Never light a gas appliance if an odor of gas is present.
- 2. If odor is EXTREMELY STRONG evacuate the building ... call for help from a neighbor's home.
- 3. HAVE A QUALIFIED PERSON turn the gas back on and relight appliances.

**REMEMBER**... Natural gas is not dangerous but its misuse is.

**TEACH YOUR CHILDREN**... to respect gas...to play it safe...to know what to do in an emergency.

KNOWLEDGE plus CARE equals SAFETY.
